

VISIONS October 2010

At the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church this summer, the Assembly voted to send to all of the Presbyteries a new item for consideration to add to our Book of Confessions: The Belhar Confession. The Confession was first written in 1982 in South Africa, and served as the catalyst for the reunification of the Reformed Churches in that country. Before you turn the page, yawn, and wonder why in the world I am bringing up something so arcane—**stay with me** for just a moment!

A new confession is a big deal. Since the formation of the Presbyterian Church in the first General Assembly meeting in Philadelphia in 1706—there have only been **eleven** confessions placed into our Book of Confessions. Together with the Book of Order, the Book of Confessions makes up the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA). If 2/3 of the Presbyteries vote over the next nine or so months in the affirmative, we will be adding a twelfth confession. **Only eleven, maybe twelve confessions in nearly 300 years!** The last addition to the Book of Confessions was in 1983 when the Presbyterian Church (USA) reunified its northern and southern branches in the United States which split during the US Civil War.

I know you would agree with me that a lot has changed since 1983. That was the year Margaret Thatcher became Prime Minister of England, Sally Ride was the first female and Guion Bluford was the first African-American US astronaut to go into space, few people had personal computers in their homes, and *Flashdance* and *Return of the Jedi* were blockbuster hits in movie theatres. **The world is different, culture is different, and the church is different. How we see and confess our faith as Presbyterians also has to be different.** The other big difference between now and 1983 is that the location of the fastest growing places for new Christians has changed. Today the fastest growth is in what is called the Global South—places like South Africa where this Confession comes from. This could be our first confession in our Book of Confessions from our sisters and brothers in Christ who represent the “new thing” God is doing in our world today! That is exciting!!!

Our Presbytery, Elizabeth Presbytery, will be voting on the Belhar Confession in the New Year. In preparation for this, I will be preaching about the Belhar Confession in worship during the last three Sundays of October focusing on its major three themes, Unity in Christ, Reconciliation, and Peace through Justice. We will be using some of the Confession’s words as part of our worship service each week. I hope you will join us on this journey of learning about what I hope will soon be our newest confession—and in reflecting on how the church in South Africa can perhaps lead us as we live into the new things God is always doing in our midst as we become a much more **global and interconnected Church**.

See you around Watchung Avenue this October—there are lots of wonderful ways to plug into the life of our congregation and community this month—lots of great ways for us to grow in faith together!

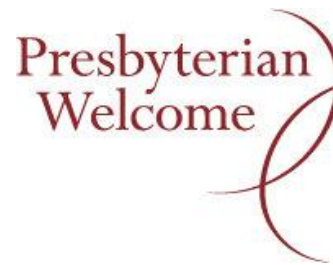

- Provide leadership and education for the exploration of human sexuality in a theological framework
- Reform the Church constitution to remove barriers to inclusion;
- Raise awareness, encourage discipleship and promote welcome in local congregations;
- Witness to God's faithfulness for those who face difficulty in responding to God's call;
- Join in partnerships with like-minded organizations to accomplish these goals.

At our September Session meeting, we decided to join Presbyterian Welcome, and we are very excited to be the first congregation in NJ to join them! We believe this will continue to position us as a welcoming and inclusive church and to strengthen our membership and witness to the inclusive love of Jesus.
