# 2012!

It is hard to believe isn't it? Another year done. A New Year beginning. I find myself at this time of the year reflecting on all of the good (and also the not-so-good) of this last year, and thinking about the things I am looking forward to and dreaming about in the New Year.

The turning of the New Year marks transitions in our lives. But the truth is that we go through transitions all the time, not just when the clock strikes midnight on December 31<sup>st</sup>. Births, milestones in our lives or the lives of our families, deaths, moves, new jobs—all sorts of transitions.

As people of faith, I think the questions for us are:

- How do we manage these transitions?
- How do we engage with them?
- Are there some transitions we encourage as a way of living as followers of Jesus Christ?
- Perhaps this New Year transition is an opportunity to let go of something or to add something as a way of deepening your life as a follower of Jesus?

Here is a thought from a Christian mystic many years ago:

*"What good is it to me if Mary gave birth to the Son of God fourteen hundred years ago and I do not also give birth to the Son of God in my time and in my culture? We are all meant to be Mothers of God."* -Meister Eckhart (15<sup>th</sup> century German mystic)

And another thought from Christine Paintner who writes on [Pantheos Online](#):

*"We may think of Christmas as a single day and then be off to our after-holiday sales. But what if we honored all 12 days of this season? What if we allowed the space from Christmas to Epiphany to be a time of sacred pause, a time to reflect on the year past, the present moment, and the possibilities held in the year to come?"*

*How might you allow these 12 days of Christmas to nurture your own holy birthing? Consider making this season a time of retreat. Even just 15 minutes a day will create some spaciousness and pause for reflection."*

The Christmas Season in our Christian Calendar is not just one day but a Season of 12 Days (remember that song?!)—a season that stretches into the New Year and ends with Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup> (we will celebrate Epiphany on January 8<sup>th</sup> in worship).

I like Christine's idea of a mini-retreat for fifteen minutes each day during the Season of Christmas. Retreating doesn't mean you have to sit in silence in your living room with the lights turned out and candles burning! A retreat could be taking a 15- minute walk around your neighborhood, praying for your neighbors you know and do not know as you walk with purpose. A retreat could be spending 15-minutes writing notes to friends and family letting them know what sorts of a blessing they represent in your life. A retreat could be opening up the Bible and spending 15-minutes reading it wherever it opens and seeing what you find. Or a retreat could be reconnecting with someone you haven't talked to in a long time (maybe even that person could be yourself!).

There are lots of ways to fill our lives with meaning and connection to God that cost nothing, but change everything in our lives and in the ones of those around us.

## WAPC Memorial Garden

### “A Time to Renovate”

The best way to get something done is to begin. With this philosophy in mind the MG committee voted last spring to begin planning for much needed renovations in the Memorial Garden.

To our knowledge, the soil has not been tested and improved since the garden was created in 1994. The plantings consist mainly of evergreens that have outgrown their space, even dwarfing the granite cross that is centered in the bed along the ramp. We wish to maintain the humbleness of our garden, but would like it to express **more joy and passion** by introducing a dwarf flowering tree as a focal point and adding ornamentals and grasses to give grace and balance in the garden. We are eager to open the planting areas up and **introduce a succession of blooming plants with varying texture and foliage.**

In the spring, some of the overgrown, misshapen, diseased evergreens will be removed, beds will be reshaped, soil will be conditioned, new plantings will be purchased and planted. The design, soil conditioning and planting can be done by some of the members of the Memorial Garden committee; however, the largest shrubbery will have to be removed carefully and professionally. As with any renovation that is to be made, there is a cost.

The MG committee is seeking donations to help with the garden renovation. Since Gail Smith announced the need to renovate the garden at the annual meeting in January, 2011, there have been three WAPC members who have donated \$1,050 toward the renovation. Our goal is \$2,500.

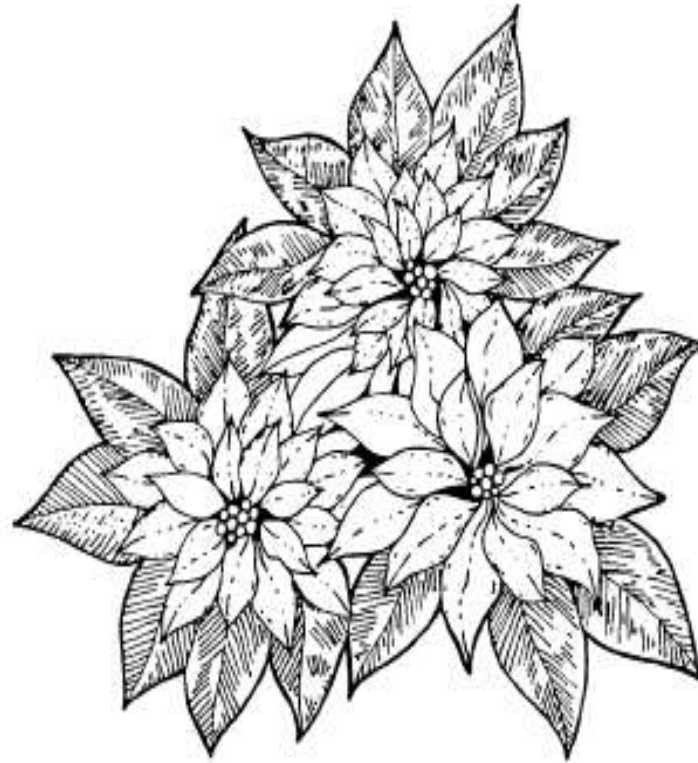
